Courses Taught

Acting 1

An introduction to the craft of acting for performance: ensemble techniques, vocal and physical development for the actor, fundamental scene and character analysis, basic audition techniques, and scene performance workshops.

Acting 2

A continuation and refinement of training in Acting 1. Students will engage in deeper textual analysis and character development through research, monologue, and scene work focusing on modern and contemporary plays from 2022-1940.

Acting 3

Exploration of vocal and physical techniques necessary for the performance of heightened forms of theatre including Greek/Roman, Shakespeare/Moliere, Melodrama, Farce, Theatre for Young Audiences, and others.

BFA Movement Lab 1 and 2

A daily practice conditioning class that works with the body, mind and spirit. Through conditioning, cardio, strength training, acrobatics, yoga, tai chi, circuit training, dance, movement, meditation, wellness students will gain flexibility, strength, endurance and stamina.

BFA Acting Lab

A course designed to give students the opportunity to explore concepts from their acting class in a laboratory environment. Using group problem-solving techniques, students will create weekly performances/semester ending performances, critically respond to others performances and develop a sense of community within the BFA environment.

BFA Jury
